June 1 – Brincos Dieras

Brincos Dieras is “the most irreverent clown in all of Latin America”. Dressed in his signature clown costume, complete with makeup and a flamboyant suit, he draws thousands of fans to his engaging live performances. An international sensation, the comic hails from El Paso, Texas, and performs on stages across the United States and Mexico.

June 5 – Hannah Gadsby

Hannah Gadsby has been a comedian for more than a decade, but it was 2018 when the world took notice when their groundbreaking comedy special launched on Netflix and stopped the comedy world in its tracks. Hannah’s second Netflix special, *Douglas* launched in 2020, and their third, *Something Special* landed on Netflix May 2023

June 7 – 8 Shane Gillis (2 performances each evening)

Shane Gillis is a stand-up comic, actor, and writer from Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania. He’s a regular guest on Sirius XM’s *The Bonfire*, Spotify’s *The Joe Rogan Experience*, and *Barstool Sports KFC Radio*. Shane can be seen playing ‘Gilly’ in *Peacock’s Bupkis* opposite Pete Davidson, Joe Pesci, and Edie Falco or in his newly released Netflix special *Beautiful Dogs*.

Oregon Symphony

June 1 – 3 The Music of Dance: Schubert and Strauss

The lyricism of music inspired by dance takes center stage in Schubert’s *Unfinished Symphony* and Strauss’s *Rosenkavalier Suite* — their rhythms and melodies evoking the opulence of 19th-century Vienna. And Artist-in-Residence Xavier Foley paints musical portraits of Argentina in a new arrangement of Piazzolla’s tango-infused *Four Seasons of Buenos Aires*.

June 8 – 10 Brahms’ First Symphony

The Oregon Symphony season concludes in a blaze of orchestral glory with Brahms’ *First Symphony*, a work of intense passion and soaring lyricism. Plus, Principal Bassoon Carin Miller displays her instrument’s suave tone and puckish agility in Villa-Lobos’s *Ciranda das Sete Notas*, while Gabriella Smith’s *One* serves as an urgent appeal to protect our fragile ecosystem.

June 12 – Oregon Symphony Special: John Malkovich in The Music Critic at the Symphony

Equipped with a frivolous potpourri of musical insults, legendary actor John Malkovich slips into the role of the evil critic who believes the music of Beethoven, Chopin, Prokofiev and the likes to be weary and dreary. Join us for an entertaining evening of comedy and classical music.

June 7 – Leanne Morgan

After discovering her passion for stand-up comedy later in life and finding the time and confidence to pursue her dream, Leanne Morgan has cemented herself as a must-watch comedian. Morgan has garnered over 2.5M followers across social media and her popular online stand-up special, *So Yummy*, has reached over 50M views on YouTube. Her fan base continues to grow with her relatability as she discusses everything from being a housewife, sharing Jell-O recipes to having a new grandbaby. June 14 – John Crist

John Crist is one of today's fast-rising stand-up comedians, with more than one billion video views, over five million fans on social media and sold-out shows. When asked where he finds the inspiration to write jokes, Crist says, "I grew up in the deep south, my dad is a pastor, and I was the third of eight homeschooled children. My first job was at Chick-fil-A. Coming from a background like that, how do you NOT write jokes?!"

June 28 – 30 – Light Opera of Portland – Iolanthe

The Light Opera of Portland is a resident musical repertory company performing live light opera and musical theatre productions and specializing in the works of Gilbert and Sullivan. **Iolanthe**, or The Peer and the Peri, **Iolanthe** or "the fairy opera," the House of Lords is lampooned as a bastion of the ineffective, privileged and dim-witted. The political party system and other institutions also come in for a dose of satire. Yet, both author and composer managed to couch the criticism among such bouncy, amiable absurdities that it is all received as good fun. Both Gilbert and Sullivan were at the height of their creative powers in 1882, and many people feel that Iolanthe, their seventh work together, is the most perfect of their collaborations.
